

# Review using *not* with *to be* and *to do*

Learn new ways to make a sentence negative







#### Word order with *not*

Word order is important. We use **not** after **to be** or **to do**.

l <b>am not</b> cold.	She <b>is not</b> from Switzerland.
l <b>do not</b> like snow.	She <b>does not</b> like winter.




#### Word order with contractions


Word order is the same with contractions.

subject + verb + <i>not</i>	subject + verb + <i>not</i>	subject + verb + <i>not</i>
You <b>are not</b> cold.	You <b>aren't</b> cold.	You <b>'re not</b> cold.
You <b>do not</b> like snow.	You <b>don't</b> like snow.	



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We can use other words to make sentences negative.

It <b>is not</b> snowing now.	lt <b>never</b> snows here, it is too warm.
You <b>don't</b> like snow.	Nobody likes snow!

<b>When</b> do you play tennis?	$\rightarrow$	l <b>never</b> play tennis.	
Where do you play tennis?	$\rightarrow$	l <b>don't</b> play tennis.	
<b>What</b> sports do you play?	$\rightarrow$	l <b>don't</b> play any sports.	
Which sport do you play, soccer or tennis?	$\rightarrow$	l play <b>neither</b> sport.	


