

Word order with *not*

Word order is important. We use **not** after **to be** or **to do**.

l am not cold.	She is not from Switzerland.
l do not like snow.	She does not like winter.




Word order with contractions


Word order is the same with contractions.

subject + verb + <i>not</i>	subject + verb + <i>not</i>	subject + verb + <i>not</i>
You are not cold.	You aren't cold.	You 're not cold.
You do not like snow.	You don't like snow.	



It is not snowing now.	lt never snows here, it is too warm.
You don't like snow.	Nobody likes snow!

Who likes tennis?	\rightarrow	Nobody likes tennis.	
When do you play tennis?	\rightarrow	l never play tennis.	
Where do you play tennis?	\rightarrow	l don't play tennis.	
What sports do you play?	\rightarrow	l don't play any sports.	
Which sport do you play, soccer or tennis?	\rightarrow	l play neither sport.	


