

Forming the superlative

When something is superlative it means that it is the greatest within a set group of nouns.

We add **-est** to form the superlative and also use the definite article **the** in order to separate the noun from the rest of its group.

big		the biggest
smart	>	the smartest
cold	>	the coldest
long		the longest
strict		the strictest



Change –y to -i

If the word ends in **-y**, we change it to **-i** and then add **-est**.





For longer words, we use **the most** and we don't add **-est**.

adjective	comparative (- er)	superlative (- est)
cheap	cheap er	the cheap est
expensive	more expensive	the most expensive
traditional	more traditional	the most traditional
contemporary	more contemporary	the most contemporary

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Using *least*


We also use **least** to form superlatives.


adjective	comparative	superlative

contemporary	less contemporary	the least contemporary

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
