The present simple

- We use **the present simple** to talk about routines, e.g. what we do every day
 - We can use the adverbs **always**, **often** and **never**

always	often	never
I always clean my teeth before bed.	l often eat pasta for dinner.	l never watch football on television.
l always eat breakfast.	I often drink coffee in the morning.	I never drink coffee before bed.



The present simple

We also use **the present simple** to talk about things that are **generally true** and for **facts**. If something is **generally true**, it is true now but maybe it will change in the future. A **fact** is true forever.

generally true	facts
I live in England.	Water boils at 100 degrees centigrade.
I love chocolate.	Tigers eat meat.

- We use the **present continuous** to talk about things that are happening now
 - We make the present continuous with **be** + **-ing**
 - We can use the words **now**, **at the moment** and **look!**

now	at the moment	look!
I am playing now.	She is eating at the moment.	Look! He is singing.
We are learning English now.	It is raining at the moment.	Look! They are eating chocolate.
