


Modal verbs of ability

Use **can** and **can't** to talk about someone's **skills** or **general ability** in the **present**. Use **can** and **can't** for **all** subjects.


Use the **base form** of a verb **after** modal verbs.

Personal pronoun	Modal verb	Base form
I	can	run.
You	can	ski.
She	can't	swim.
They	can't	do yoga very well.



l can play football.	l could play football.
He can run a marathon.	He could run a marathon.
She can't swim very well.	She couldn't swim very well.
We can't climb mountains.	We couldn't climb mountains.







Modal verbs of advice

- Use **should** to **give advice** or say something is a **good idea**.
 - Remember to use the **infinitive** after a modal verb.

Personal pronoun	Modal verb	Infinitive	
I	should	study for the test.	
You	should	do exercise regularly.	
She	should	be an athlete.	
We	should	go surfing this weekend.	



You should **do** exercise regularly.



We **should** go surfing this weekend.



Giving advice



Should is often used to **give advice** when there is a **problem** or **complaint**.

Problem or complaint	Advice
l'm tired.	You should go to bed.
l'm fat.	You should do more exercise.
I feel sick.	You should go to the doctor.
