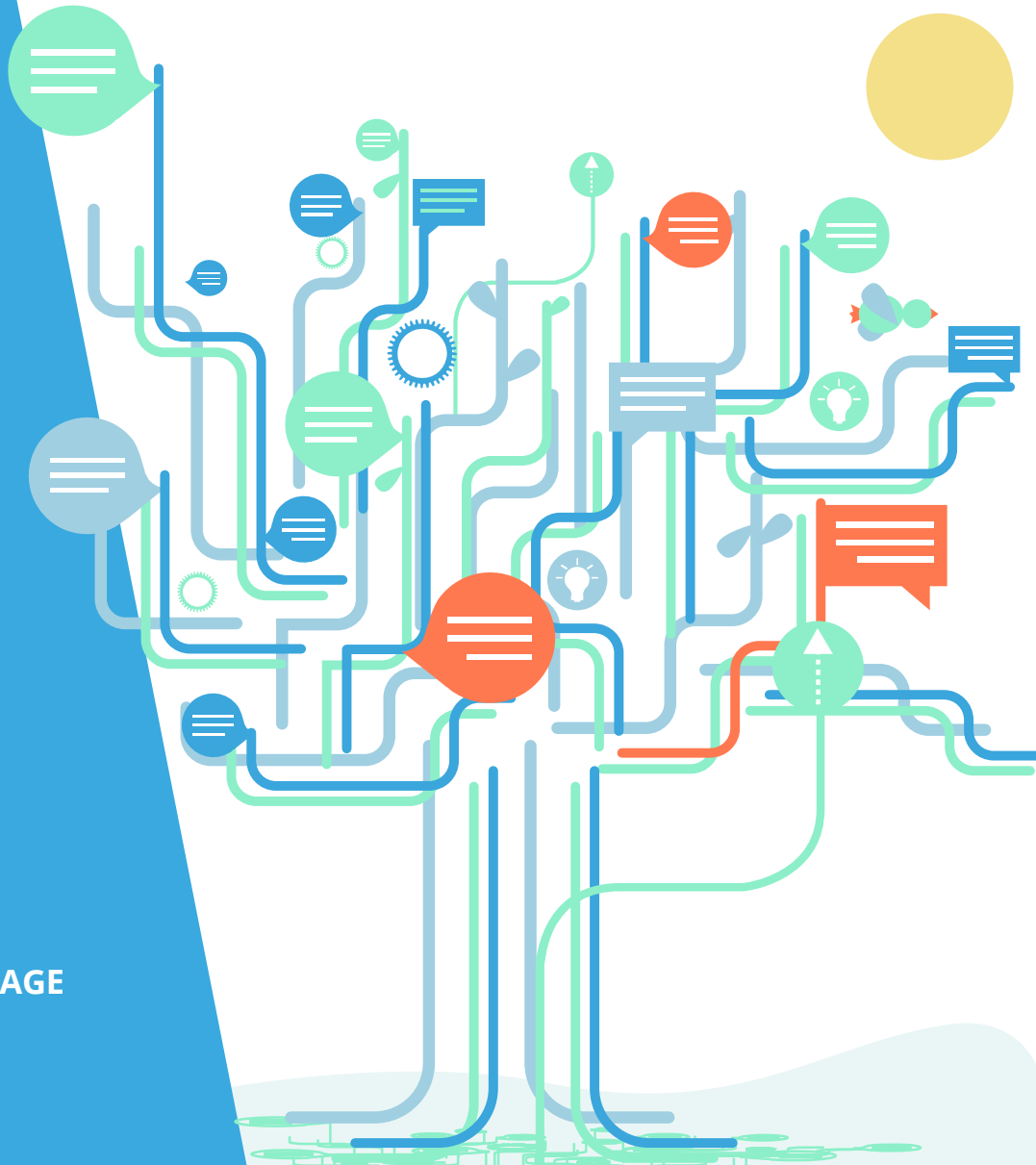

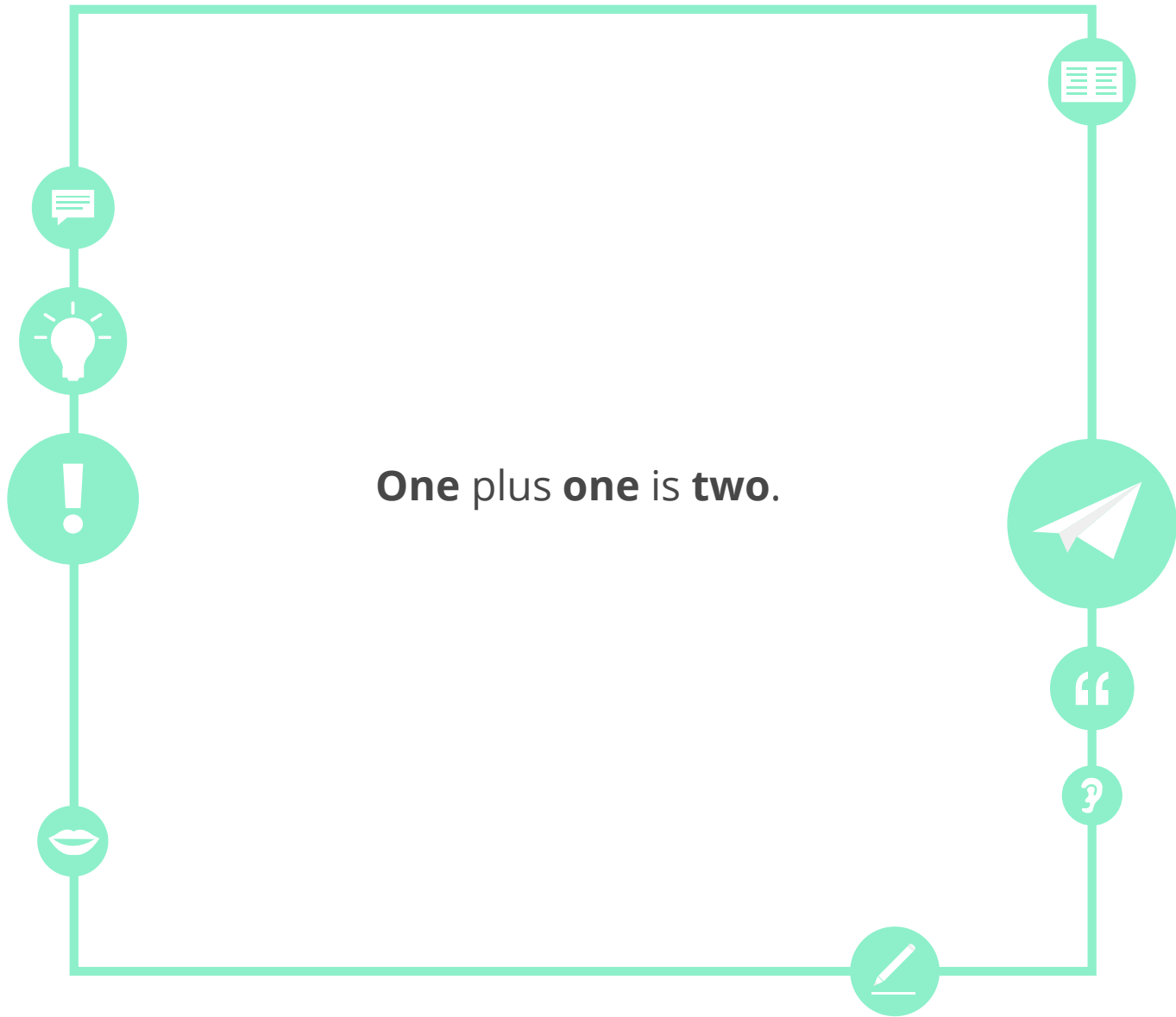

one sun	<b>There is</b> one sun.



## Talking about plural objects

- Use **There are** to talk about **plural** objects.

<b>three countries</b>	<b>There are</b> three countries in North America.
<b>five people</b>	<b>There are</b> five people in my family.
