A doctor works in a hospital.






Who works in a school?

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■ We use **isn't** and **aren't** in **be -** questions.

- is not = isn't
- are not = aren't


Questions	Answers
Who is a doctor?	l am a doctor.
Who isn't a doctor?	You are not a doctor.
Who is a teacher?	You are a teacher.
Who isn't a teacher?	l am not a teacher.




■ We use **don't** and **doesn't** in **do-** questions.

- do not = don't
- does not = doesn't

Questions	Answers
When do you drive to work?	I drive to work when traffic is light.
When don't you drive to work?	l don't drive to work when traffic is heavy.
Where does Kim live?	Kim lives in Switzerland.
Where doesn't Kim live?	Kim doesn't live in Germany.




We can ask short questions.

Who isn't a doctor?	She isn't a doctor.	She isn't.
What do you drive?	l drive a car .	A car.
What don't you drive?	l don't drive a taxi .	A taxi.
