

Using the verb can

- Use can + **verb** to talk about your abilities
 - the form of **can** stays the same for every pronoun

| pronoun + can | ability |
|---------------|-----------------|
| I can | speak English. |
| You can | ride a bicycle. |
| They can | see you. |



Asking a question with can

When asking a question, **can** comes first, and the **subject** comes second.

| Statement | Question | |
|------------------------------|----------------------------|--|
| I can speak English. | Can you speak English? | |
| You can make an appointment. | Can I make an appointment? | |
| We can go to the doctor. | Can we go to the doctor? | |



How many questions can you make using can?





Using the verb can't

To make can negative, we add **not** to make can't. This means something is not possible.

| Positive form | Negative form |
|--------------------------|----------------------------------|
| l can see you. | l can't see you. |
| We can go to the store. | We can't go to the store. |
| She can read in English. | She can't read in English. |



Asking questions with can't

Asking questions is the same as with **can**. **Can't** comes first, and the pronoun comes second.

| Statement | Question | |
|-------------------------|-------------------------|--|
| You can't hear me. | Can't you hear me? | |
| We can't see. | Can't we see? | |
| He can't play football. | Can't he play football? | |
