The present simple

- Use **the present simple** to talk about an action that is **regular**, **true** or **normal**.
 - Use **personal pronouns**, a **verb** and an **object** to form **the present simple**.

Personal pronoun	Verb	Object
I	play	football.
You	like	pizza.
We	live	in Madrid.
They	have	dogs.



The present simple

■ Here are some examples of when to use **the present simple**.

When to use it	Example
Regular actions in the present	I take the bus to school.
Facts	People speak English in Wales.
Habits / Routines	I go to bed at midnight.
General truths	lt rains a lot in Ireland.
